



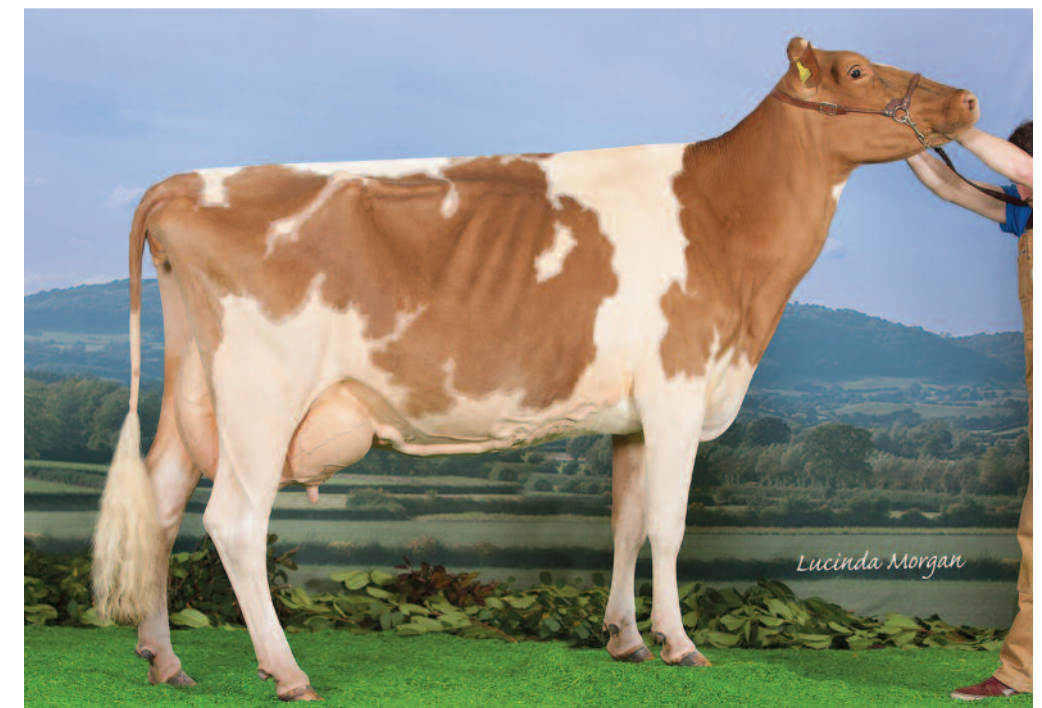

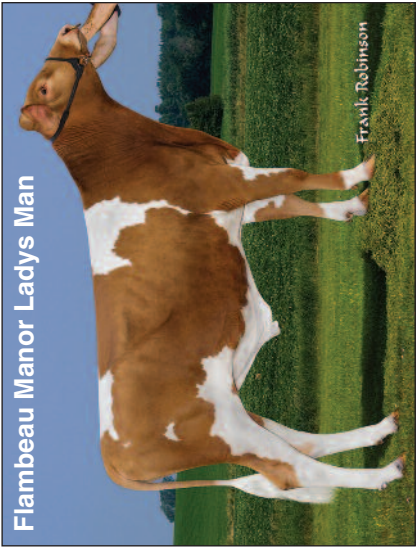

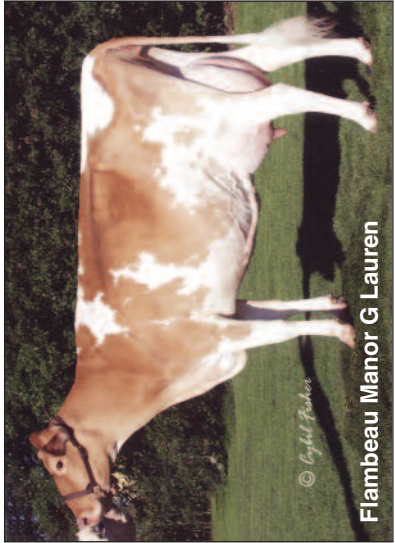

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## Editor's Letter 2017

Dear Members and Friends of The English Guernsey Cattle Society,

Yet another year has passed and here we are approaching another Christmas and the year end, it is quite alarming just how quickly the months fly by when here I am preparing another Breed Journal. It seems to have been quite a tumultuous year, in farming and in the wider world. Not a day passes that we are not reminded of the political uncertainty and the utter upheaval that is Brexit, that is facing this country and in which, we as farmers are supposed to operate and ultimately feed the country. Maybe it would focus the attention of those that are supposed to be working towards the greater good of the UK, if Lunch and Dinner did not appear at regular intervals, as expected. Maybe all concerned would not be so keen on posturing if their stomachs were rumbling. As far as dairying is concerned, yes we have seen an upturn in prices in the last few months but after the ruinous period that came before, all, we as farmers, can hope for is an opportunity to catch up on the backlog of unpaid invoices, before the threat to drop the price again next year materialises. No business can be expected to operate efficiently in such volatile conditions, especially one as essential as agriculture. One beacon of light who will no longer be fighting the Farmer's corner is lost to us with the tragic death of Derek Mead. Part of my extended family (his mother and my grandmother were first cousins) he is the third member of my family to have died in a farming accident over the years including Derek's own brother, Roger, thirty years ago. This is in addition to my own father who narrowly avoided death when he was jolted off the back of a tractor, went under a ring roller and ended up in the chain harrows at the age of 16, he carried those scars to his dying day. This is a sobering thought and why I continually remind my two sons of the dan-

gers. I think sometimes the farming community is driven to take chances and sometimes make very dangerous mistakes by the sheer burden they have to shoulder on a daily basis with little or no appreciation or understanding at times from the general public. Derek brought the plight of the dairy industry to a wider audience, never forgetting his roots and always promoting the interests of the family farm. The dairy world is a poorer place without him.

We have also lost some substantial characters from the Guernsey world in 2017, in particular Dennis Warren, who was an inspiration to us all with the way he coped over the last 20 odd years, when ill health robbed him of so much, but he never let that stand in his way when he was on a mission. In the last few weeks fellow member Ted Brook succumbed to a long illness and many members will have attended his funeral, remembering a dear friend and colleague. These and others are remembered in the pages of this Journal. We cannot talk of loss without remembering the terrible blow to Ernie Durose and his mother of the Leighgrange herd in Staffordshire, who virtually lost their whole herd to TB this year. Fortunately they managed to hold on to their in calf heifers and have been able to buy a few replacements, here and there, but I would ask all members who find themselves with surplus stock to think of Ernie first and give him a call on 01538 722357.

Let us move on to happier times, the excellent two days of the Annual General Meeting in September hosted by President Colin Glead, ably helped in this by Dawn and Gideon Lacey and many of the family and workforce at Bolter End Farm – a very enjoyable time was had by all. As usual our members have competed at national and local, three day and one day shows across the country throughout the year. Our congratulations go the owners and breeders

of the many Champions and Reserves, all of whom are given well deserved coverage in this Journal, but also to those who did not quite make the top spots after travelling many, many miles to be there. I am thinking in particular of Matt Blanch and Georgie Sweet of Biilingshurst, also the Dawes family of Banbury, who have extended their show repertoire to include many more shows in 2017, particularly the national show at The Dairy Show where they have achieved considerable success – well done to you all and many thanks from the Society for giving up your time to promote the Guernsey breed. With reference to the national breed show, many thanks to all who made the day go so well. Admittedly numbers of competitors were down because of TB restriction, but in spite of that some fine animals were on display and the Stand and the hospitality unit received a steady flow of visitors all day – my thanks to all who contributed to this in any way.

## Introducing our New President Andrew Payling

First of all I would like to thank the council members for putting my name forward, I feel it is a great honour to be asked to be your President.

I started with the breed in 1988 when I took the tenancy of Ivy Cross Farm in Standish. There was a Guernsey herd here at the time, which moved to Cornwall, and a small diversification enterprise selling unpasturised cream, which lasted until the first TB test! I purchased Guernsey cows from Peter and Caroline Burton, and a couple you may have heard of, Maurice and May Durbin! And progressed from there.

I have also been an active member of Quality Milk Producers (QMP) over the years, working to maintain and promote Channel Island Milk and the Gold Top Brand in the commercial sector.

Our farm increased to 135 acres over the years and we were milking 100 cows and rearing 40 heifers per annum on a simple system of grazing in the summer, and grass silage and concentrates in the winter. This worked well for a small farm with no employed labour.

I believe the Guernsey cow is a fantastic animal who will produce 5000 litres plus on a basic forage ration, or respond well to extra feeding when the milk price to concentrate price ratio is favourable. The taste, texture and colour of Guernsey milk is second to none, along with the temperament and manageable size of the cows. As a breed I feel we need to play to our strengths and not try and emulate other breeds. I believe that if we push the breed too far out-breeding, the losses will be greater than the potential gains, if indeed there are any. The best

Guernsey cow is well proportioned and moderate in size, easy calving, with good (self maintaining) feet, is easy to get back in calf and of course producing the characteristic rich coloured quality milk. I hope we can all work to maintain these characteristics in a commercially sustainable cow.

We have at least 18 producer processors giving the consumer access to our wonderful Guernsey products both locally and nationally. From the farm/farm shop, farmers markets (including those in London) and delivered to your door! They include many variations or varieties of milk, cream, butter, ice cream, yogurt and cheese, to mention just a few. The enhanced customer awareness of how food is produced means customers will travel many miles to collect milk and other dairy products direct from the farm. Our A2 story is also a strong milk selling point. Quality Milk Producers have run several initiatives to promote Guernsey products which are always well received, and have provided producers with useful feedback. QMP are currently working on an initiative with producers in the West Midlands on the best ways to promote their products.

The challenges ahead are many and varied. TB still has devastating effects on individual farms, and the continual tightening of legislation just makes the farmer's job more difficult. The fallout from Brexit is unknown and while it may be good for anything we produce in this country, I'm not convinced it will be good for the country as a whole. Then there's the weather! However farmers are resilient and resourceful and will ride out whatever is thrown at them. I see a good future for the breed, particularly where the milk can be processed on farm or goes into dedicated Guernsey (or Channel Island) products.

Rachel and I had the privilege of being invited to regional dinners in the South West (Devon) and West Midlands where we were made extremely welcome with great company and great food. This has shown us it is not just the cows who are a pleasure to be with, but the breeders too!

I look forward to meeting many more of you over the coming months.

## CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2017 – James Warren

When I wrote my report for our Annual meeting, 3 months ago, it was at the end of what had been a beautiful summer's day on the 27<sup>th</sup> August and having just shut the cows out after evening milking I listened to one of my favourite sounds of cows munching on grass with crickets hard at work in the background. How easily pleased am I! Now on 22<sup>nd</sup> November I have just brought the cows in as we are fortunate that the weather is still allowing us to turn the cows out each morning which is a help and I think a benefit to the cows also. Some of our neighbours are still making silage with grass still growing with the very mild weather we are having. When I look back at last year's report my wish for a better return for our milk has certainly happened and with Autumn/Winter prices still looking strong let's hope that the demand for our products keeps coming and that some current farmers don't get too greedy and over-supply this demand. The only problem we have here and I suspect with so many others, is that the extra income we are receiving seems to be going out just as quickly as we play catch-up for the last 3 years.

With the show season over for another year there has been some new faces on the circuit again and many old faces frustrated at home due to T.B. restrictions. For the second year running Norman and Sales won the North Somerset Show with their maiden heifer and at Devon County Show Chris and Louise Carpenter won with their 5 year old in milk cow Fairfield Bonnie. It was a win for the Cox family from Wales at the Bath and West and the Guernseys were interbreed champions in pairs and a group of four, 'WELL DONE TEAM GUERNSEY' and Royal Cornwall saw the same champion as last year, but for her new owner Nicola Bottom; congratulations to the Manford family for their champion at the Kent Show in the Channel Island classes and a special mention to Matt Blanch and his partner Georgia for turning out such excellent animals in their first year of showing. It was a

great turnout of Guernseys at UK Dairy Day for judge David Mann who had strong classes at the breed's debut at this event. Champion went to the Greenslades with Abi Marshall in reserve with both of these animals being bred by Ian Crouch and the same two cows repeated their success at our NATIONAL GUERNSEY SHOW at Shepton Mallet which was again a great event and my thanks to all of the sponsors and a big thank you to James Bartlett and his family for their hard work in preparing and hosting the hospitality suite.

Our Young Handlers continued to shine at the All Britain All Breeds calf show and the quality of cattle and handling is a credit to our breed. Champion Handler went to Heather Limond with her sister Charlotte in reserve and George Thomas was Honourable Mention. Champion calf came from the Sales and Barnes partnership and Emma Greenslade was in reserve. Our breed has another new 95 point cow this year in the UK being Bickfield Vanessa 37<sup>th</sup> now in her seventh lactation. She won our National Breed show in 2015 and congratulations to the Durbin family on this achievement.

Guernsey cattle are very much still in demand and as a breed we struggle to find enough to fill this demand. Those who follow Global Guernsey Marketing on Facebook will have noticed the strong resurgence over the last few months as more and more people are trying Guernsey produced products. T.B. is a continuing plague that we have to carry on farming with and my sympathies go out to those who have lost a few cows or even herds and with it years of breeding and hard work, I know from experience that this is heart breaking. T.B. is also affecting us by hampering our selection of bulls to go into A.I for collection.

Financially our Society did not have as good a year in 2016 as the previous year with profits down £11,000 to just over £2000. This is due largely to semen sales down £9000 which I think is mainly linked to the milk price we were being paid with

more natural service being used and beef semen, because in the first half of 2017 semen sales have been strong. Levy was also down £1000 and classification costs have risen per cow which added £1500 to our classification expenses. We are having much more interest in our semen from around the world as they appreciate the quality we have to offer, in particular the high fat % our bulls have and this is something we are keen to promote and in turn it will help spread the cost of semen collection. I know here at Tredinney in the last 12 months we have had daughters born of Tredinney Ivan's Flo Rider and Bourton Grumpy's Claude and these would be some of the best calves we have had for a long time and I am eagerly awaiting for them to come into the milking herd. Both of these bulls have semen still available from the Society and I think the Society has the best selection of bulls that it has ever had at the moment.

In the last twelve months we have lost some very dear friends and members and we remember with much appreciation all that they did for the breed. Austin Tweedle of the Ballamead Herd, a member of the Southern region and a familiar face around the shows in particular the Royal Show and the European Dairy Event where he was a steward for many years, Margaret Eddy, the widow of Michael of the Treloweth Herd who used to prepare the beautiful garland for the Champion at the Royal Cornwall show. Also, Dennis Warren of the Tredinney herd. We are grateful for his support and help to Mum and myself which is greatly missed. His presence and enthusiasm around breed events and shows will not be forgotten and we personally thank those who kindly sent messages of condolence and the large number of society members who attended his funeral.

Also in the recent weeks, Ted Brooks who had the Leybrad herd. I remember him being a good reliable member of Council during my early years on Council and his dispersal

The EGCS were delighted to have a Guernsey entry at this year’s UK Dairy Day. Twelve cattle were forward from 7 Exhibitors for Judge David Mann to place.

David found his Champion in Blacknor Cracker Iceberg Diana owned by the Greenslades in Devon. She was bred by Ian Crouch as was the Reserve, Blacknor Cracker Weston Duchess now owned by Abi Marshall. Hon Mention went to Kimcote Legend Fragrant 4 from the Thomas family from Leics.

This was the first year that Guernseys have been included at UK Dairy Day held at Telford International Centre. For this reason it was a pleasure to have been asked to judge at the show.

The first class of the day was Heifer in milk with four heifers entered. I placed Kimcote Legend Fragrant 4 in first place. Having been born in Birkenhead, Austin returned to his mother's birthplace on The Isle of Man, following the death of his father.

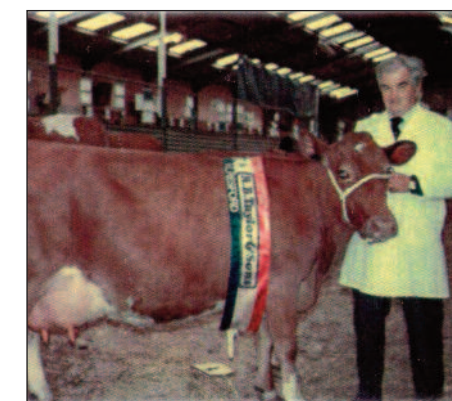
Austin held a lifelong ambition to be a farmer. He was an intelligent young man and had been offered a Grammar school place back in Birkenhead, but hid the letter from his parents so he could go to the same school as his best friend. However, after school he was offered a place at Cannington College of Agriculture, which he was very pleased to accept. From there he took a job in Basingstoke tending the prize winning "Shiwa" herd of pedigree Guernseys and this began his passion for that Breed.

He met his future wife, who was

the daughter of a dairy farmer at Basingstoke Young Farmers Club. They married in 1954 and took the tenancy of a small farm in Compton near Winchester, starting with a herd of thirty Guernsey cows, they gradually built an accredited herd of seventy, "The Ballamead Herd."

In 1972 Austin, Pat and their two children relocated to a nearby, larger farm, avoiding the impact of the extension of the M3 Motorway. Retirement in 1993 took Austin and Pat to the New Forest for eighteen years, before moving to Romsey in 2012.

Throughout his life Austin maintained a great sense of humour and was an engaging raconteur. He enjoyed playing whist and bowls, loved Viennese music and was an avid



reader. He was a loyal member of the Guernsey Society and enjoyed stewarding at The Royal Show and at The European Dairy Farming Event. With fellow members he visited the Island of Guernsey many times.

Austin died on the 14th April 2017 and is much missed by his wife, daughter, son and grandsons.

### Dennis William Warren

Dennis Warren passed away unexpectedly on the 18th May 2017, aged 70 years following many years of ill health.

He was still active up until a couple of days before his death and in his last weeks enjoyed seeing the Guernsey Young Handlers Weekend at Tredinney, his 70th Birthday with friends and family and a short holiday on his much beloved Exmoor. His funeral was held on the 5th June at St Buryan Methodist Church with about 400 people in attendance.

Husband, brother, dad, grandad, uncle, godfather, best man on 5 occasions, friend, neighbour and affectionately known to us at Boscarne as Uncle Dennis.

Born 16<sup>th</sup> April 1947 at Tredinney to Will and Iris, a brother to Maureen and Joy. He attended Brane Chapel and Sunday School and also Crowsan-wra Sunday School every other week.

The two trips to Chapel on Sundays were usually by foot and I am told mainly at a good pace as their father Mr Will Warren would very

often be gone preaching and they were left to finish up the work.

When Brane Chapel closed the family transferred their membership to St Buryan and later in life Dennis became Chapel Steward, Circuit Steward and was very instrumental in the building of the new Chapel which we are in today.

At the age of 11 the family moved from Lower Tredinney back to Higher Tredinney where he stayed in the same house for the rest of his life. Believe it or not Dennis had piano lessons at an early age on Saturday afternoons but because he hadn't practiced all week Saturday mornings were spent practicing, he did not enjoy this one bit but his lessons came to an abrupt end when the teacher held a concert for all of her pupils at St Ives Guildhall, where they all took turns playing the grand piano on stage.

Dennis was so intrigued by this piano and watching the workings of it that it wasn't until he got part of the way through his recital which



he had started playing by memory that he realised his music was upside down. Dennis lost his place the teacher sternly said I think you need to turn your music around and his mother in the audience was hoping the floor would open up.

Dennis attended Kelynack School followed by Cape Cornwall and then continuing his education by attending Camborne Tech. and evening classes at Heamoor taking profi-

ciency tests in ploughing, baling, welding and spraying. A Sunbeam Imp was his first car and according to my father was quite a sporty model in its day and would go like a rocket, especially if Desmond Nicholls was out and about as well.

Besides working at home he also did some contracting with Malcolm Hosken mainly making silage and even going as far afield as St Erth. He was one of the first in the area to make silage and I think at the time it was quite a talking point amongst the neighbours, but I have no doubt this would not have phased Uncle Dennis, in fact I expect he enjoyed being a pioneer.

He was a very active member of St Buryan YFC being chairman and going on to be leader and president. He would have a go at most activities, cooking up a mean mixed grill for competitions day and becoming quick step county finalist with the help of a special young lady. This lady was Rosemary Cargeeg, from Cardinney and they married on the 4<sup>th</sup> April 1973.

It was a marriage that stood the test of time and Auntie Rosemary was a huge pillar within their family and business and a lady I'm sure he loved so very much. He always joked that they never really had a first date as the first time they met was probably in prams in the lane.

James was born in July 1975 and Catherine April 1977 and together they have lots of happy memories at Tredinney where their father would make camps out of straw or pallets, erect swings and just generally made time for them or anybody else who visited the farm. He loved to entertain, whether it was friends or family and make light of any situation.

We all have our own memories of his humour but one or two that spring to my mind include the tail-board of the silage trailer on which he painted the words **no hand signals I turn in silly places!** and his ability to persuade at least one of the team sheeting down the silage pit that the perished tyres that we were throwing were actually eaten by a rubber beetle. Also gatherings at

Tredinney where party games would be a plenty although not necessarily organised by himself but participation would be with much enthusiasm. We always chuckled at home when he would refer to the old new barn which was the new barn until a new barn was built which was then named the new new barn and still referred to as that to this day.

Trips to the beach and days out with James and Catherine were always great times, although we did seem to spend more time trying to find a tree or a shaded area for Uncle Dennis to sit in or under than we did eating our picnic.

Dennis's interests included The Western Area Agricultural Competitions, (our local ploughing match) rough shooting, ferreting, following the Lambo beagles and the Western hunt, playing snooker on a Monday evening with Jonathan Warren, Charlie Cutting and my Grandfather on Mr Percy Williams's ¾ size snooker table. And not forgetting his fixing and mending, although it was mainly to keep things going rather than pleasure. He did enjoy it and revelled in the challenge. These challenges were many but included a huge metal tank that he bought from Tower Farm here in the village. 12,000 gallons, after a bit of help from Paul Severs he had an axle bolted underneath and a drawbar to the front, this thing which seemed like the QE2 made its way slowly to Tredinney on a foggy evening. The tank was never actually used but the mission was complete. Another challenge was a low loading trailer that he bought at a reasonable price, but at nearly 10 foot wide would only just fit up the lane. So an hour or two with the grinder and welder and me with the oxycetylene kit we had narrowed the trailer up and it went on to give many years of service.

It was this willingness and enthusiasm to overcome, I always found quite inspiring.

In 1995 he inspired James and the business to have a go at purchasing the whole of Lower Tredinney. James would have been happy with just purchasing a couple of fields on their

side of the lane but Dennis was insistent that they should buy it all. A decision that James quickly became pleased they took.

In 1980 Dennis purchased some pedigree cows from the Longthorpe and Mount Pleasant herds which prompted them to pedigree the whole herd. James took on the running of the herd but Dennis played a big role in increasing the size of the milking parlour which was a 4-8 which I believe was one of the first in the area, to the present 21-42; he was very recently part of the decision to join Roddass as a direct supplier and helped James plan the extended dairy to accommodate the new tank.

Ill health started to restrict his active role on the farm. In the early years of his illness it would not be unusual to find the tractor or tele handler missing from the yard but just a crate or steps of some description that he had precariously used to get access into the cab. Latterly he would be out on his buggy trying to be of some help or simply showing an interest. Although on some occasions getting stuck or even venturing plenty far enough, making it as far as Sennen garage on a busy summer's day. The all-terrain use of these buggies would eventually take its toll but his reluctance to throw anything away meant that the shed in the garden is full of worn out scooters, and I know James was always under strict instructions not to throw certain items of scrap away as it may come in handy.

When Rosemary left in the morning she had a feeling that it could be the day the baby was born, so later that day Rosemary rang home to see if there was any news. Dennis answered the phone and when asked is there any news Dennis replied yes we got a budgie. The budgie just appeared on the door step and James was put to find a suitable cage whilst Shelley had started labour. The budgie proved to be great company and often repeats Dennis's phrases.

In 2006 when Catherine married he wanted to walk her down the Aisle. With his determination and the aid of sticks he managed it, James married in the same year and so the family grew with the addition of 4 grandchildren Harry, Sam, Sophia and Lily, he was very proud of his children's achievements but espe-

cially of his grandchildren and would do all he could for them, mending toys, babysitting or giving them rides on the buggy. Only a month ago Dennis made it to the opening of the games room built at Leedstown school with money raised by the family to help Harry when he was diagnosed with his condition, which I know at the time hit Dennis very hard.

From his early age Dennis always wanted to visit the Norwegian fjords and see the Northern lights, both of which they managed to do before his health deteriorated too much.

But right up to the end he enjoyed an active social life enjoying 3 days on Exmoor in April, attending Peter and Elizabeth's Ruby Wedding An-

niversary where he gave an impromptu address, taking part in the Guernsey Young Handlers weekend, the recent Beagle meet and having most of the family around for his 70<sup>th</sup> birthday.

I was fortunate to visit him only a month ago, where I saw his usual cheery self, showing great interest in what was going on and as per usual even I struggled to get a word in edgeways.

It would be on these visits that I and I am sure everybody else who met him would be humbled by his positive spirit which would in turn give us the strength to deal with any problems in our own lives, however big or small

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## Henry ‘Harry’ Ernest Worth (Aged 92)

Some of the seed fell in good soil and produced much fruit...

There’s much fruitfulness to be thankful for as we recall to mind, and give thanks to God for Harry’s life.

Harry’s life took root near Saltash, Trewolsta, at Tideford Cross to be a little more exact. Harry was not the keenest on school and but was keen to learn from the ‘school of life’ perhaps! So when he was still young, approaching school-leaving age, he worked as a butcher’s boy in Tideford. I guess that might have developed, but the war intervened and although he was perhaps technically too young, at 17, Harry volunteered for the Far East and went to places he’d never have expected to encounter. This took him to Burma, where later in life he learned he should have received the Burma Star medal, which he did eventually get. He was involved in liberating prisoner of war camps in Singapore and he was also a despatch rider for Vera Lyn, as she sang to the troops. He got to know her well as her escort driver and he remained a great fan thereafter! Although years ago Harry didn’t say so much about his war experiences various parts of his story did emerge in later life. He expressed how deeply those things affected him in other ways, he was a British Legion member and in fact a founding member of the Legion Hall built at Tideford. Remembrance Day was always an important day for him.

Coming back after the war, the butchery work led to work for while in a slaughterhouse, and then working for SWEB as a linesman at a time when mains electricity was becoming something everyone wanted. If they could put up “a post a day” Harry said everyone was happy. One of the first things Harry did when he got back was order a Triumph motorbike. He loved that bike; things couldn’t be purchased so easily at this time – he had to wait for 9 months for it to arrive!

Harry met wife-to-be Hazel at a village dance; they married at Quethiock Methodist Chapel in 1955; Just before marrying Harry took on Eastwall Farm at Tideford Cross from his father.

The family grew, as Stephen was born at Eastwall, Tideford Cross then after moving to a bigger farm at



Gunwen Farm Luxulyan near Bodmin in 1957, Andrew then Brian were born. During this time there was growth in farming as well as the pedigree dairy herd of Guernsey’s became a real focus on the farm; breeding, and showing was one of the things Harry was known for. In 1986 they moved farms again to Troswell near Launceston, then in 1994 Harry and Hazel retired to the village of St Neot.

There are so many things you will picture when you think of Harry, that calm-natured chap with the cheeky sense of humour. The man who loved his dogs, they were good companions in retirement; perhaps you’ll picture him driving and walking on Exmoor and Bodmin Moor.

Sadly Hazel died in 2015 and Harry then moved in with Brian and Jo at Lanlivery where Brian and Jo still have some of the “Hazelcross” Guernseys.

Thanks go to Meadowbrook Nursing home, Lostwithiel, who looked after Harry most recently. He was very popular there.

He was immensely proud of all his grandchildren and what they were doing.

One Isle of Wight-based dairy business is working hard to add value to its milk in a bid to mitigate the on-going volatility faced by all UK producers. Rachael Porter visited to find out more.

It's a hive of activity when you drive into the yard at Bridlesford Lodge Farm, near Wootton Common, on the Isle of Wight. Not least due to the building work to add the finishing touches to the new bottling and processing plant, that's been under construction for the past 12 months.

"We're almost there – we're just waiting for the filling line," says partner in the farming business Paul Griffin, who's charged with running the dairy herd and on-farm processing at the unit. "We should be bottling milk in the new factory by May – or at least that's the plan."

He's the fourth generation of his family to run the 140-cow Guernsey herd, plus 70 followers, at the unit. Cow numbers have been increasing slowly from 70 cows back in the 1990s, after a new cow house was built to facilitate expansion. And that's not been the only investment. The old cow house has been transformed into a café and, opposite that, another barn has been converted into a farm shop, selling Bridlesford Farm Dairy's milk, clotted cream and cheese.

## ADDING VALUE

"We're now taking on-farm processing to the next level," explains

Paul. "We felt that moving into bottling milk on a larger scale was more economically viable. And we've also started to make cheese – a Haloumi-type and a Cheddar – as well as cream and butter.

"About half the milk we process will be liquid and the other half will be cheese, butter and cream. It's about adding value and expanding our capacity to do that. The new bottling facilities have been in the pipeline for a while. So it's exciting to finally have them up and running. We want to process more of our own milk, rather than selling it to a buyer."

Most of the milk produced by the island's 10 dairy herds is bought by Arla and Medina and is destined for supermarket shelves on the mainland. "And that leaves producers wide open to market fluctuations," says Paul. "We hope to mitigate some of that and to also add some extra value to our milk."

Indeed, the processing plant will 'buy' milk from the herd at around 35ppl – considerably more than the price currently paid for milk taken by Paul's current buyer. "But it's not just about the price – it's also about taking back control and adding a bit of stability to the business."

## A2 MILK

The herd at Wootton Common has always been Guernsey.

There's a small 'museum' on the farm yard that visitors can explore for free, which comprises old farm implements and machinery, some old photographs of Paul's ancestors, as well as some of the founding Guernsey cows. "We're keeping up a tradition with the Guernseys, but the breed also suits our farm and system," says Paul, adding that the breed has a placid temperament and they're easy to work with. Guernsey milk certainly lends itself to processing – particularly cream and cheese. And Gold Top milk, of course. "It's also A2 milk, which is another string to our marketing bow."

Paul says that it's particularly easy to select A2 sires to use on his herd because the A2 gene is prevalent in the Guernsey breed. And he tests all his heifers for the gene.

"We've been able to breed for a predominantly A2 herd

pretty quickly. We've been taking this route for six years now and progress has been rapid. We've been using A2A2 sires on A2A2 females and most our herd is now A2A2 – just a few of the older girls are A1. That said, we are now in a position where we can say that we produce A2A2 milk and our poly bottles are labelled as such."



## LOCAL MARKETS

Milk from the herd is sold direct to shops and cafés on the island, as well as the Co-op supermarket. "Eventually we want to be processing 100% of our milk on farm – that's our target. There are a few hurdles to jump, but I'd like to think we'll be doing that in a year. We could even supply milk to customers off the island – there's nothing to stop us. I think 'Isle of Wight' milk has a market both here on the island and off it. I think it could 'stand up' anywhere."

Paul says that he's lucky in some respects. "Inputs that need to be imported to the island, such as feed and fertiliser, can be more expensive for IOW producers, compared to those on the mainland. But the island also gives us a niche – the milk we produce here is IOW milk."

Cows calve all year round, but there are larger summer and autumn blocks. Average yield for the NMR-recorded herd is 7,000 litres at 5.0% butterfat and 3.8% protein, with a so-

matic cell count of less than 200,000 cells/ml. "We're aiming for a level supply of milk throughout the year, particularly now we're planning to process most our milk," says Paul.

## FAMILY-RUN BUSINESS

He manages the herd with help from his mother and father – Judi and Richard. Paul's wife Christine runs the café and his sister Louise manages the farm shop. "The shop is an important outlet for our milk and dairy produce and around 50,000 people visit us each year." Indeed, Paul says that all the different aspects of the business are crucial to its survival: "The shop and café wouldn't exist without the farm and I think the dairy herd would struggle without the shop and the café.

"They add value to our milk, raise our profile and bring in an essential stream of additional income."

The herd is managed on a con-

make the most of grazing because it all tends to dry up come July, which is when we start buffer feeding. Cows stay out until October or November, depending on ground conditions and the weather. Three cuts of grass silage are taken each year, from the unit's 89 hectares, which are predominantly down to permanent pasture.

Paul also grows 18 hectares of forage maize, although he plans to split this and grow nine hectares of maize and nine hectares of wheat for whole cropping this year.

## VEAL CALVES

All bull calves from the herd are reared on farm for veal, which is sold through the farm shop and restaurant. "And we sell one or two breeding bulls each year too." As well as the family, the business employs two part-time staff: "There are always two people working on the farm at



ventional TMR-based system, with cows housed during the winter and out at grass from early spring.

"We like to produce as much milk from grass as possible, but run them on a fairly high input system. Guernseys can be slightly more difficult to get in calf compared to other breeds and it's essential to minimise the negative energy balance that follows calving and avoid fluctuations in body condition score throughout their lactation."

Turn out is typically in late March or early April: "As early as possible. This is important if we're to

any one time," says Paul.

More staff could be on the cards, once the new processing plant is up and running: "And we're also looking at continuing to expand cow numbers – we have the space to do that.

"But, for now, our focus is on the processing side – getting that new plant up and running and firming up our place in the market. We may also look at adding other dairy products, such as ice cream, to our range in the future. Guernsey milk makes superb ice cream. Then we'll take a step back and look at the herd again."



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## The Mundowry Herd



Growing up on a mixed farm in West Lancashire, dairy farming was something I wanted to do for as long as I can remember. The dairy herd was sold before I was born however we reared heifers and sold them freshly calved through the local auctions and by the age of ten I had set my sights on one day milking my own herd.

I worked for the neighbour's relief milking and soaking up all the dairy knowledge I could and after completing my A levels, I decided to head down under and got myself a job on a 450 cow farm in NZ. This was a new experience for me, no buildings and little black Jersey x cows. It was a cold and wet spring and we were calving over 30 cows a day but I enjoyed every minute. From there I travelled over to Australia where I first came across the Guernsey breed working for Evan and Dianne Cowell of the Caronia herd in Wagga Wagga NSW. They were great cows to work with and I quickly developed a soft spot for them. After over 12 months away I returned home and completed my Ag degree before returning to NZ for another season and then moving back to the Cowells in 2012. In 2016 we returned home and in October of that year I got the tenancy of Breworth Fold Farm in Chorley, Lancashire, a 160 acre dairy farm.

I wanted to run a block calving herd and get as much milk from grazed grass as possible, so I set about subdividing the fields into 4.5 acre paddocks, putting more water troughs in and improving access with tracks as well as starting to reseed. The herd is made up of 120 cows at the moment and we have enough heifers in the pipeline to take us up to 200 milkers by Feb 2019. The herd consists of mainly Jerseys with about 30 crossbreds and 15 Guernseys, which we are always trying to increase on. Our main purchases came from the Trewey herd and the Oxlynch herd as well as purchasing Trewey Dollar, to cross over some of the Jerseys, which I am registering with the Guernsey Society. With the Guernseys I wanted a more traditional type, with good fertility and components as well as being not too big, they have to go out and graze in February and we are in a fairly high rainfall area at 550 foot above sea level.

This year I have used Bourton Grumpys Claude over all the Guernseys and across the smaller Jerseys. My daughter Freya who is 6 is keen to increase the numbers of Guernseys as they are her favourite, having her own

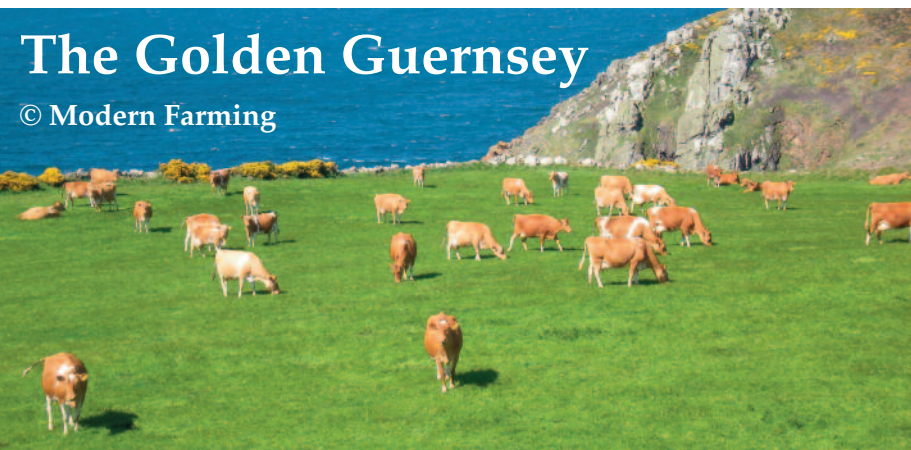

For the future a new parlour is in the pipeline as well as extra housing and to continue with paddock work. Guernsey numbers will hopefully keep increasing as we breed the type of cow we need to suit our system.

# The Golden Guernsey

## HISTORY

There are many theories about the history of Guernsey Cattle but its origins can't be verified. It may be true the Isigny cattle of Normandy, and the Froment du Leon Breed from Brittany are relatives and that cows from Normandy were brought to the The Channel Islands. In fact, the Jersey, the Guernsey and the Froment du Léon are the only members of the Channel Island sub type of European Blond cattle.

The Guernsey cattle did, however, develop into a distinctive type and finally in 1700 the Guernsey was recorded as a separate breed. In 1789, imports of foreign cattle onto the island were banned to ensure the purity of the breed.

## DISTRIBUTION

Most Guernseys are concentrated in the South West, particularly Cornwall, but there are other herds across the UK with 4000 pedigree cows on the mainland and a 1000 pure-bred cows in 'commercial' herds.

The English Guernsey Cattle Society (EGCS) have maintained the Pedigree Herdbook since 1884 and are responsible for the accuracy of the pedigree system and for breed improvement.

Guernseys are popular across the world with cattle and semen being exported from the island. In the early 20th century, cattle were exported to the USA and Commonwealth countries and is now established in Australia, Canada, New Zealand and South Africa with a significant population in the USA.

## BREED IMPROVEMENT

In 1992 the idea of a Guernsey Global Breeding Programme (GGBP) was first put forward at the World

Guernsey Conference held in Guernsey. Dr. Ted Burnside urged breeders to unite to ensure the future of the breed.

This led to increased cooperation between Guernsey breeders across the world to develop a dairy breed which could compete in the modern world. Launched in 2001, GGBP had (by 2010) 85 per cent of mainland Guernsey herds and all Island herds using allocations of GGBP semen.

James Warren is Chairman of the EGCS and, as well as other cattle, runs 110 Guernsey on his 550 acre farm, Tredinney Farm near Lands End where his family have farmed for five generations. He confirms the need to develop the breed.

"Because there are so few Guernseys," he says, "the AI companies aren't really interested so we need to push breeding to improve the breed keeping the good traits.

"We are breeding the positive genetics so the modern Guernsey is now bigger and we have improved production. Fertility has always been the worst aspect of Guernseys but we are improving that by choosing the most fertile lines.

"The butter fat has also increased and the milk is 90 per cent A2 which is a big selling point. The colour and the taste is what's important and there has been an increased demand. We were selling to Dairy Crest but now our milk is going to Rodda's who want Channel Island milk to put colour in cream.

"Though Guernseys are a dairy herd, you can eat their meat when crossed with a continental breed and this is rich in fat which has great flavour. People are also doing their own veal which I would like to do if I could."

Though there is increased interest in the breed, buying in a full herd would be difficult reveals James. "We've got people who want Guernseys," says James.

"But there aren't enough cows. If you just want a few you could get them but you would struggle to get a big herd.

"As a breed they are very docile and the easiest breed to work with. And, they are a lot healthier than Holstein," he confesses.

## A WINNING FORMULA

Nick Gosling, Vice Chairman of the EGCS, owns an organic 350 acre mixed arable and livestock farm and Berkeley Farm Dairy in Wiltshire.

The family-run farm has a herd of 180 Guernseys which are grazed outdoors most of the year and enjoy deep litter beds in winter. He supplies organic milk, cream and butter to shops and wholesalers across the south of England

Nick explains; "My father chose the breed back in 1947 to sell the milk locally. It was hugely popular because of its cream and did really well. The milk fell out of favour years ago but it is becoming more popular again."

Nick has to import sexed semen from America because AI companies in the UK won't sell in small quantities and Nick wants to ensure he is breeding heifers.

"We have bred our own in the past from our own bull, but we want to only breed heifers so we need to use sexed semen," he explains

Nick loves the Guernsey because the breed is easy to handle. "You can't get a quieter cow," he admits. "They have a gorgeous temperament. Bulls, when they get old, are quite mean but the cows are wonderful."

However, he admits that breeding can be difficult. "The calves like to die," he confesses. "The calves are not very strong and need extra attention when they are young."

Nick's recent win at the Soil Association Boom Awards proves how popular his pure Guernsey milk is. The organic Guernsey whole milk he supplies to Abel & Cole was awarded Overall Winner of Best of Organic Dairy Products.

What a wonderful display of Calves and Showmanship we saw at the ABAB this year. There were Quality calves throughout the classes and the standard of Showmanship was outstanding. Our young members were a credit to their parents and the Breed. Well done to all those who took part and thank you to all Exhibitors for facilitating their inclusion in the weekend activities. Interestingly, all the calves forward were home bred this year. Also, a big thank you to Caroline Huins and Laura Barnes our FGB co-ordinators, for stewarding the classes so smoothly.

In the Showmanship Classes, the handlers took part in the Coloured Breed section and notable performances came from Charlotte Limond who was 5th in her class and her sister, Heather, who topped a class of 18!

The top placed Guernsey Handlers in each class then went on to compete in the Guernsey Showmanship Championship. Champion was Heather Limond, Reserve was Charlotte Limond and George Thomas was Hon. Mention.

There were 21 calves forward. Judging the Calf classes was Iwan Thomas who was particularly impressed with the quality of animals on show and found his Champion in Avalon Fernando Linda from Sales and Barnes. In Reserve was Greensfield Flying Diana from Emma Greenslade. Hon Mention was awarded to Avalon Fernando Indus also from Sales and Barnes.

It was particularly pleasing to see the new Breed Uniform on show by all the young handlers and how smart they all looked in the ring.

Here are the results in full.

The first class of the day saw the Junior calves represented by 3 great examples of the breed, with the eventual winner being Edgehill Leopold Violet, 2nd going to Highway Legacy Andrews Dot2Doris and 3rd to Edgehill Latimer Violet. My winner oozed breed character through the front end and gained the advantage over the very close 2nd for her added strength of crops and spine, slightly more correct rump structure and superior locomotion, second over third taking advantage of her greater scale and width throughout, especially through the rump, whilst also having a phenomenal depth and openness of rib. The third placed calf was the youngest in the class, who I admired for her breed character and depth of rib for her age.

In the winter calf class, I was presented with 2 very different calves, In making my decision, I went with Vanda Lillian in first place taking the edge over my second Edgehill Latimer Meadowsweet for her added width of chest, her better topline and correctness of rump, over a super dairy calf that possessed beautiful bone quality and tremendous skin texture.

My third class, the autumn calf, saw a strong class of heifers forward with once again quality right down the line, but I found myself an easy winner in Avalon Fernando Linda, a calf that had superb style and presence, it was this style and her overall correctness, especially her openness of rear rib, rump structure and tremendous locomotion, that gave her the advantage over the second, Kimcote Bruce Diesel 5, she in turn, edged out the third placed, Kimcote My Dear June for her extra height and strength of front end, length and depth of body, whilst 3rd took the advantage over 4th, for her depth of rib and bone quality.

The summer calves saw a fantastic showing of 8 calves, with once again quality right down the line, and I found the pair at the top hard to split, but my eventual winner was Greensfield Flying Diana, who took the advantage for her added width of chest, openness of rib and locomotion over the close place second, Avalon Fernando Indus, who in turn, edged out the third placed calf, Kimcote Conquest Valerie for her style, width of chest, overall length of frame and correctness of the rump. Third taking the advantage over 4th for her stretch and length of neck.

In the mature calves, I found another tremendous class, although a mixture of types, I found a pair of calves that fit the type I was looking for at the top, calves that had balance of dairyness and structural correctness, I eventually pulled in Highway Legacy Ripple at the top of the line, a calf I preferred for her overall balance, strength of spine and width of rump over the second placed, Greensfield Andante Pickles, who followed so closely in type to my leader taking the advantage over Latifa Andante Mary 2 in third for her more feminine head, cleaner brisket and flatter quality of bone than my third, who in turn took the advantage over the 4th place for her strength of spine and locomotion.

It was an honour to be invited to judge the Guernsey Classes at the calf show, an experience I thoroughly enjoyed, with the young breeders so enthusiastic about the Breed.



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# Report on the World Dairy Expo 2017

At the end of September I went on a family holiday to Canada and U.S.A. and tied this in with going to the World Dairy Expo in Madison, Wisconsin. It is a six day show of dairy cattle with different breeds being shown each day. Mum and myself were there on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> October when the Guernsey heifers were being shown in the afternoon and the next morning commencing at 7.30 a.m. the in-milk classes started. It was a great experience and for me (a cow geek) I could have spent the whole week there. There were over 200 Guernseys at the show with the biggest class having 24 forward. There were two judges, a senior judge and a junior and they worked together. Each animal was turned out immaculately and I did not see any animal misbehaving for the whole show of any breed.

Each breed has a sale although the sale animals do not have to be entered in the show.

The Heifer show (junior) was split into 7 classes, with animals born from 31<sup>st</sup> May 2017 to 30<sup>th</sup> November 2015, with each class having a 3 month age range.

The first class Spring Heifer Calf 1/3/17 – 31/5/17 had 21 forward and was won by Landen Knapp with a daughter of the legendary Knapps Regis Tambourine.

The third class Fall Heifer Calf

had 24 forward and was won by Nicleys HP GG Cordell Anne-ETV who was sired by Ripley Farms Aaron Cordell, who went on to being the Champion Junior Guernsey. The Reserve Junior Champion came from the seventh class Fall Yearling Heifer and was Gr-Dix Lee Royce Starskittles sired by Villa Crest Royce owned by the Chupp family. Premier breeder and exhibitor went to Landen Knapp of Knapps Guernseys who had a tremendous team of cattle at the show and premier sire was Springhill J Lone Star.

On the Friday morning commencing at 7.30 with their National Anthem the intermediate section began. The first class entered was the yearling heifer in-milk from the age of 1<sup>st</sup> September 2015 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2015 through to the Senior Three Year old cow from 1<sup>st</sup> September to 28<sup>th</sup> February 2014. Landen Knapp did extremely well again having animals in five of the six classes and winning three firsts, two seconds and three thirds but the Champion Intermediate went to Adam's Creek Ap Bianca by Indian Acres American Pie, owned and bred by Alyssa Nuttleman. This was a beautiful heifer and although not the biggest had a fantastic udder and was tremendously balanced, an easy winner in my opinion

with the first class being Four Year Old Cow. This was the best class of Guernsey cows I have ever seen and had 13 forward with quality from top to bottom and even the last placed cow could be a class winner at many shows that I have seen. The winner was Springhill Mentor Jazzy ET who is a maternal sister to Springhill Jackpot and Judgement. She is an awesome dairy cow with a perfect udder and as good a Guernsey cow I have ever seen and when walking through the cattle lines the evening before I thought she would be the one to beat, she is a big cow but is very well balanced.

The classes for the five year old and finally six years and older followed. The six years and older was another good class and winning this was Lantz Farm Preppy Indy another beautiful cow with tremendous strength and dairyness and good udder. Third in this class was Flambeau Manor RO Lauren EX 95 (dam of Ladys Man) who had been the Supreme Guernsey Champion of

the show for the two previous years.

Senior Champion and overall Grand Champion went to the 4 year old Springhill Mentor Jazzy ET shown by Chris Lang of Springhill, who judged the Guernsey classes at the NEC in July 2015, with the 6 year old class winner taking reserve and honourable mention went to the heifer in milk Adam's Creek AP Bianca.

The standard of cattle on show was fantastic and each animal was turned out immaculately. When seeing them in the lines the day before I thought to myself that I would have probably left some of them at home, but by the time they entered the ring every quarter was balanced and I did not see any cow of any breed running it's milk. What did surprise me was that there did not seem to be a particular uniform with white trousers and a variety of coloured shirts.

After the showing was the Guernsey sale where there were about thirty lots for sale of heifers and embryos. The top price was \$9100 for the Champion Junior heifer Nicley's HP GG Cordell Anne and this was the first time that a champion heifer had been put up for sale. The top embryos was an open flush of five embryos out of the grand champion cow Springhill Mentor Jazzy and made \$1550 each.

Stand out memories for me were descendants of the Knapps 'T' family with 25 entered in the show and I was told that Knapps Ace Tamera has 98 offspring from calves up to cows with 20 being scored as EX cows so far. Sires that stood out were Springhill J Lone Star, Jens Gold Aaron Copper, Indian Acres Pies, Indian Acres American Pie and Lang Haven Grumpy Novak. The cows were of a bigger stature than those in the UK but

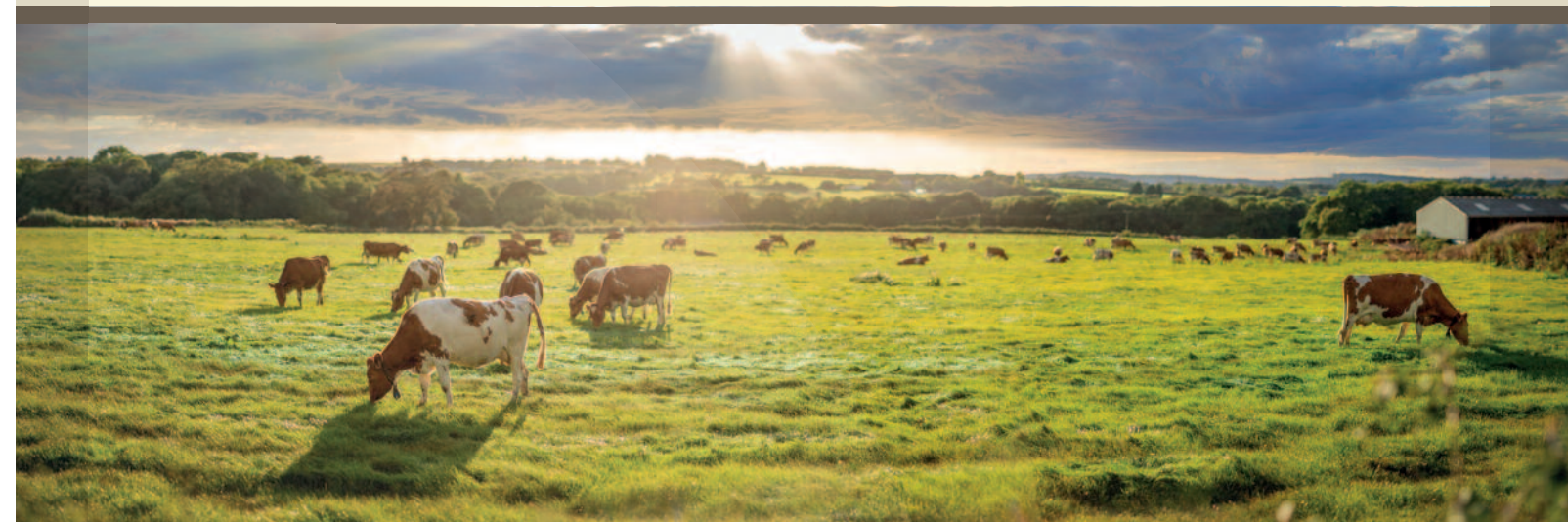

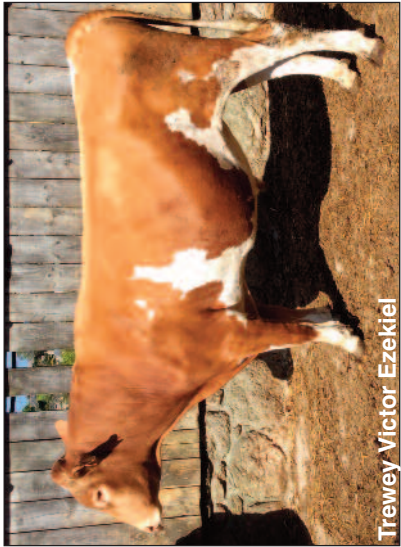
